Barkham Arms

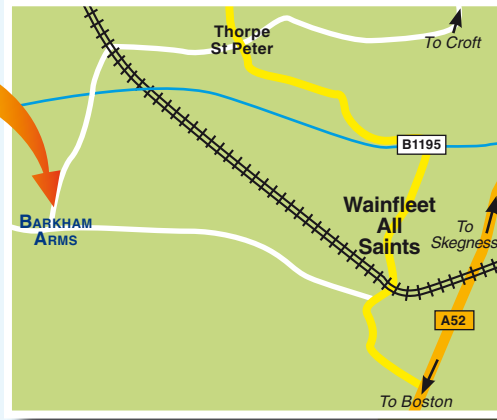
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The Barkham Arms is located approximately 5 miles from Skegness. The site is peaceful, picturesque and secluded. It hosts both touring and static caravans.

The Barkham Arms is the on-site pub and restaurant, where fine ales and Sunday lunches can be enjoyed (children are welcome). There is a fishing lake on the park – perfect for relaxing. There are lots of leisure activities available in the area, including water sports, golf and bowling.

The site is located just off the A52 and the nearest market town is Wainfleet.



Wainfleet is a small, peaceful, historic village with traditional buildings and pubs (the village pubs serve some of the counties finest ales). Batemans Brewery is well worth a visit – take the popular and interesting tour and discover how beer is brewed (*you can even try some!*).

Wainfleet's biggest attraction, alongside the brewery, is the Magdalen Museum. This is a Grade 1 listed building and a scheduled ancient monument. The original interior of the room shows a large timber roof, resting on stone corbels, each carved as a human head. The museum was founded by William Patten, later known as William of Wayneflete (this is the old spelling of the town). A powerful force in the 15th century, William later became Bishop of Winchester and Lord Chancellor of England.

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
